It is our firm belief that even the most deviant young people may repent and become charitable.

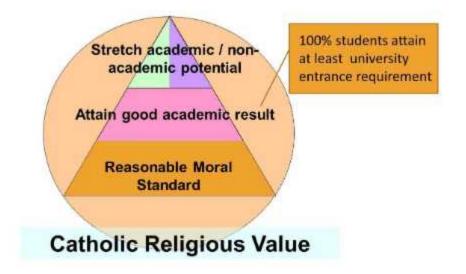
Application of our convictions
